Don't bottle it up

Five local Rotary clubs – Cooroy, Eumundi, Noosa, Noosa Heads and Noosa Daybreak – have joined forces in a campaign for PTSD and mental health and are registered as Rotary for Mental Health (R4MH). Launched by the Cooroy club on 16 May with an inspiring presentation by Dr Ben Isbel, more than 100 attendees learned about strategies for good health and mindfulness particularly within an ageing population.

Their focus will be a 'Don't bottle it up' campaign and they already have support from celebrities, politicians and sporting organisations. These include Noosa councillors who have given their strong support, Channel 7's Rob Brough, and football codes in Noosa, the Tigers, Dolphins, Pirates and the Lions. Sandy Bolton MP said the joint drive by the Rotary clubs represents a positive direction for our community. Wide Bay MP Llew O'Brien agreed that mental health is an area of significant concern and its impacts have been magnified by Covid. The campaign is raising funds for a major event during Mental Health Week in October.



I recently attended the Top Tourism Town Awards ceremony in Brisbane and I'm pleased to say that we were not only a finalist but rated very highly by the judges.
