By raising awareness, creating tools and resources for parents and educators and organising community events it hopes to encourage personal connections and restore the village support network.

Cont. from p1 outstanding success in areas such as sustainability, humanitarian work, leadership, advocacy, technology, product development, education, health and innovation.

Mel Manley is a well-known local identity who has worked tirelessly as an advocate and financial supporter of Forget Me Not Australia since 2007. Forget Me Not works with the Nepal Government to provide a lifeline of hope for children trafficked into orphanages and children's homes to give them a safe house and reconnect them with their families. They support the child and their family through education, counselling and upskilling of family members.

More than 80% of children in Nepal institutions are not orphans. Global research shows they are

taken from their families, largely on the promise of education at boarding school in lieu of a family's life savings. This is a form of modern-day slavery as traffickers change a child's identity and sell them to an orphanage or home where they are used to generate funds.

Mel is currently travelling in Nepal with a couple of Eumundi locals to catch-up with their team for the first time since November 2019. There will be more news to share about her work on her return!
